Para L and Para B Pay Codes

If you supervise paras, please be sure when you are approving time in Skyward you are verifying the accuracy of time for ParaL and ParaB codes. Paras should be clocking in and out to use those pay codes only for the times they are qualified to work under that code. Your help with this time monitoring is much appreciated.

PARA HIRING PROCEDURE UPDATE

Beginning immediately...All paras who are being recommended for hire *must* be approved and the recommendation submitted by your building principal in an email to Kathryn Mayfield, Courtney Carpenter, and Jennifer Nider. Reminder, HR does not do any reference checks or vetting process on para applicants. References must be checked by the building hiring team.

SEPTEMBER 20TH IS NEARLY HERE!

September 20 is a <u>critical</u> <u>SPED financial count day</u>!

You must accept or amend new IEPs and complete new placements on or before September 20. Any new evals should be given priority to meet this date.

REMINDERS

- Mileage forms are due the 25th of every month.
- Please complete your annual required training as soon as possible. To access them, simply click <u>HERE</u>. It's important to complete all the trainings by August 31. Once you're done, please don't forget to submit the verification form at the bottom.

Random Moment Time Study

This applies to Related Service Providers, a few Special Education Teachers, Administrators, and School Counselors. The RMTS is a survey that is used to determine the amount of time spent on activities that are Medicaid related. Your participation helps your school receive federal funds for activities done that are necessary to provide students with health-related services like speech therapy.

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PARA INSERVICE TRAINING

Thank you to our brave volunteers, Ryan Erickson and Kelsey Reynolds!

Our paras experienced a powerful visual of the precipitating factors that can impact behaviors. They also learned ways to support students with selfregulation strategies.

WAMEGO SPIRIT

The Wamego High School Cheer team wants to expand the Cheerleading experience to student aged individuals (4 years old+) in USD 320 with an intellectual disability through a Wamego Unified Spirit Clinic that is called, Wamego Spirit. Wamego Spirit will be a Cheer Clinic made up of participants and partners that will practice and perform together. The Clinic will be overseen by WHS Head Cheer Coach Aubrey Brown. <u>Partners</u> will be current members of the WHS Cheer team. <u>Participants</u> must be in the USD 320 school district; must have a recognized intellectual disability defined within 42 U.S.C. Section 12102(ADA).


REQUIREMENTS: Participants must have a participation form and signed waiver completed and on file at WHS – **Please read, complete, and return the next page to the high school.**


