IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- Snapshots must be shared with all general education teachers only with a need to know. After this is shared, put a signed/dated copy in the student file for documentation purposes. Be sure you are in the "snapshot group" and you must be added as an auxiliary user on each student. If you are having troubles, email Diana at phillipsd@usd320.com.
- All IEPs are in person meetings unless an emergency arises. Adobe Sign is available if needed. If you are new, I will send you a separate email regarding how to set up your Adobe Sign account. Returning staff will use the same accounts they used last year.
- HB 2322 ED=Emotional Disability (NOT Disturbance)
- **Dyslexia** is under learning disability with psychologist approved checkbox access, linked to data in the evaluation report which specifies its eligibility. The state will be collecting this prevalence data and will provide more info for training.
- Parents/guardians should check the consent boxes. Please allow parents to be the ones to check the boxes to ensure they provide consent. Initials next to the boxes are NOT necessary.
- Be sure to darken/bold the boxes on the hard copy filled in by the case manager so they are clearly visible to the parent before the meeting occurs.
 Copies of forms are often too light to see. Do a print preview to be sure NOTHING is cut off from top, bottom, or sides.
- By law, IEP services must begin the first week of school and go through the
 last week of school and IEP service time and make-up sessions must be
 attempted for teacher/provider missed sessions. Schedules should be established
 before the first day of school. Please drop your schedule into the 'Schedules'
 folder under your district and building in the '2024 Special Education Shared
 Drive.'
- IEP timeline compliance and IEP timeline (timelines for IEPs, teacher and parent input, ample time for additional service provider input, importance of 10 day drafts submitted for Jennifer Nider or mentor to review)
- **Special education transportation** is a related service based on student need not convenience and must be listed as "ST" in the IEP. "AC" must be in the IEP if there is a need for attendant care with a para. Be sure to contact Erica (bammese@usd320.com), Teri (bailes (milesd@usd320.com) immediately if a para bus aide is needed even if there is already a bus aide on the bus. No one-to-one para unless necessary. Invite the director of transportation to IEPs with transportation.
- Final due date for IEPs is April 11, 2025. All annual IEPs should be moved prior to this date and only new evals with permission signed after February 1, move-ins, or transition IEPs should happen after this date. This is a hard deadline because there is so much compliance work to be done between April 11 and May 15th.
- Progress reports must be written and go home to families at every quarterly
 grading period, when moving or leaving services, with the annual IEP if more than
 two weeks since the last progress report and must go home the same way each
 time as listed in IEP.
- Benchmarks are only written for students who are likely to take or are taking the DLM.
- Be sure to gather strong data for the current baseline to show growth.
 What Specially Designed Instruction is happening?



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- Licensed renewal and continued waivers check your license expiration date and begin any renewal process as needed. Work well in advance because it can take 3-6 months for the state to process the licensure. Continued waivers, please send an updated signed plan of study from the college, proof of enrollment in class for the 2024-2025 school year, and unofficial transcripts for proof of completed class for 2023-2024. Reminder, a waiver is good for a maximum of three years. When your content coursework is completed usually with 12-15 hours designated on plan of study, you should apply for a provisional license which is good for a maximum of 2 years with one 2 year renewal after completion of 50% of remaining coursework for a total of 4 years on a provisional license.

All annual IEPs are due on or before April 11! IEPs held after April 11 should be **ONLY** new evals or new move-in IEPs.

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Random Moment Time Study
This applies to Related Service Providers, a few Special Education Teachers,
Administrators, and School Counselors. The RMTS is a survey that is used to determine the amount of time spent on activities that are Medicaid related. Your participation helps your school receive federal funds for activities done that are necessary to provide students with health-related services like speech therapy.




