Transition Activities

We have implemented a variety of activities to better support our students transitioning from Second to Third Grade and from Fifth to Sixth Grade. These include Transition Visits for both grade levels.

Second Grade will visit West Elementary on Thursday, May 16 and meet with Mrs. Flinn and the Third Grade Teachers. They will also receive a tour of the school. Mrs. Dow has made multiple trips to West with students that demonstrate high anxiety to help ease some of their concerns and start to build connections for these students. We have done the same thing with some of our Fifth Graders that need these extra visits. Thank you to Mrs. Graber, Mrs. McCarter, Miss Smith, and Mrs. Bieberle for assisting with these visits.

We did have to cancel our Move Up Night for Central and West, due to the impending weather on May 6, but we are taking care of this in house with our staff taking each grade level "up" to the other grade level hallways to visit and meet the teachers. Fifth Grade will make have Move Up Night on Thursday, May 16 at WMS.

Back to School Night/Parent Night Fall 2024

We tried to do this at the beginning of the year, but had to shift, due to our new interactive boards/projectors not being installed until late. In the past, Back to School Night was an open house format where parents and students could come to the school in a come and go format and drop off school supplies, meet the teacher, and see their classroom. Parent Night was generally held two weeks after school started and was more formalized, with a presentation by each teacher in his/her classroom. After input from PLC Teams and our BLT last year, we will combine the two events to increase our attendance for "Parent Night". Generally, we have had 100% attendance at Back to School Night and more like 55-60% at Parent Night.

Students will drop off their supplies/backpacks and then be dismissed to a specified location with other staff. The MTSS team has already started the process of analyzing the data and seeing the progress students have made throughout the year. We also have multiple years of FastBridge data on each student that teachers can review to determine individual growth. Each intervention teacher continues to meet with our students individually to share their results on the FastBridge data. Sharing progress with students motivates and makes them more accountable for their own learning. This is always an exciting time of year where we can celebrate students' success with them.

The MTSS team is beginning the process of transitioning students to the Middle School. Student visits, creating documents, updating all caseloads/data and sharing relevant information with the Middle School will help the transition be more smooth and successful.


Third Graders Basket Weaving:

In English Language Arts, Third Grade students learned how some Native Americans first migrated from Asia to North America, how many scientists think they spread throughout the continents of North America and South America, and how their ways of obtaining food changed over the years. Students learned details about how people adapted to the environment of the region in which they settled and how that adaptation shaped their customs and cultures. As a culminating activity for the unit, students created their baskets in cup weaving. This was a great way to provide a hands-on activity that followed the storyline of one of the texts the students read called Alemeda, the Basket Weaver.



Third Grade Science – Fruit or Vegetable:

Third Grade students have been discovering how plants reproduce in hands-on exploration labs during science class. In one lesson, students became plant scientists and examined common grocery store produce of radishes, tomatoes, potatoes, celery, and cucumbers. First, students created predictions if the items were a science fruit or science vegetable. Then, students were able to take the role of a plant scientist to explore "hands-on" by looking at slices of produce to search for seeds. Finally, as a class, the students drew their own conclusions if the items were a science fruit or a science vegetable.

Fourth Grade Book Tasting:

Fourth Grade classes participated in a "Book Tasting" this month! Teachers set up their rooms "cafe style" and presented multiple books for each of five genres. Students rotated through the five genres taking about 15-20 minutes to read a "snippet" of a book or two within each genre. Students enjoyed lemonade and snacks as they rotated around and completed a book review of each book they got a "taste" of!



Fourth Grade 50 State Showcase:

After months of hard work researching the United States regions, Fourth Graders proudly displayed their knowledge at the Annual 50 States Showcase! Each student chose one specific state to research the Climate, Culture, Landforms, Landmarks, and Products/Resources. They drafted and typed their information into structured paragraphs, organized and created a poster with those write-ups and pictures, and even built a diorama of their state at home! One new aspect of the project this year was that students also researched a famous person from their state. Students wrote scripts from that person's point of view and dressed like their person for the showcase! Family, friends, and West Elementary students and staff were invited to the Fourth Grade 50 States Showcase to see the incredible work done by each student!

Fifth Graders Observe Solar Eclipse Together:




<u>Fifth Grade Math – Drawing, Analysis, and Classification of Two-Dimensional Figures</u>

This spring, Fifth Grade students are learning about 2D shapes and working with volume in math class. Students used unit cubes to practice volume by drawing, analyzing, and creating their own rectangular prisms.

Students have also been working on analyzing and classifying quadrilaterals. Students answered the question "When is a quadrilateral classified as a kite?" by creating their own. Mrs. Price's class took their kites for a flight.

Art News:

Cerealism Mosaics based on the Artwork of Michael Albert:

The Third Graders have been very busy cutting and assembling their collage-based product packaging boxes to create a "cerealism" mosaic based on the artwork of Michael Albert. While viewing some of the boxes, you may note that the artist has kept the identity of the product packaging by the size and shapes of the tiles used. However, others do not even remotely resemble the products they were originally intended to store and/or transport. The viewer sometimes has to jog their memory bank to see what the color combinations remind them of until they experience an "ah-ha" moment.

The Fourth Graders are working on still-life drawings of assorted items from Hot Wheel's Cars to Meal Toys from popular fast-food restaurants. They are focusing on drawing basic shapes to create an object and then assembling a variety of items together to create a composition or picture.

The Fifth Graders are working on understanding tessellations. Tessellations are a shape that interconnects with itself repeatedly on all sides. After cutting a translation tessellation, the students tried to transform their shape into something based on a shape observed within their tessellation
